### **GUIDELINES**

Applicant must be a current member in good standing of the Middle Atlantic Chapter and is expected to maintain membership for the following school year.

Scholarship money will not exceed \$1,000.00 and is to be used for tuition fees and required materials for an AOSA accredited teacher education course. Priority will be given to applicants using funds to complete their Level I education.

Recipient must be currently teaching music to children in a public or independent school setting, at least half-time.

Upon successful completion of the coursework, the recipient is asked to contribute a short article for the chapter newsletter about their experience. Additionally, the recipient is expected to present a short activity as part of the annual Middle Atlantic Chapter Sharing Workshop.

### **TO APPLY:**

- Submit a résumé and cover letter describing your motivation to begin your education in the Schulwerk.
- Applicant **must** submit a letter of reference/recommendation from an employer or colleague.

Application for scholarship must be emailed, hand delivered, or postmarked by **March 17, 2018**.

The applicant will be notified by the Scholarship Committee on or before **April 1, 2018**.
